Bucks Innovation & Improvement (BIIG) – (grant award range: \$10,000–\$25,000) LOIs are due no later than **October 1st, 2018**. Following an LOI meeting with FCP, full applications are due no later than **October 15th, 2018**.

Capital Improvement – (grant award range: \$10,000–\$25,000) LOIs are due no later than October 1st, 2018. Following an LOI meeting with FCP, full applications are due no later than October 15th, 2018.



"Through our relationship with Bucks County Community College, students are able to really experience service-learning, a form of experiential education in which students learn to solve community problems and achieve real objectives for the community while earning college credits," said Ron Bernstein, Executive Director of Foundations Community Partnership. "Many of our Partnership in Education winners have been selected for the Summer Youth Corps so they can continue their community service work."

Visitors to Lake Nockamixon have a new ease of access to enjoy the lake, regardless of disability. Through the efforts of the Friends of Lake Nockamixon, the State Park now hosts Bucks County's first ADA accessible kayak/canoe launch. The launch, which includes a gangway and aluminum floating with ADA features, make it easier for people in wheelchairs or with limited mobility



to get in and out of kayaks, canoes and other boats.

"It is great to see that the adaptive community now has a place to come to have a nice day on the water without the difficulty of getting their kayak in and out of the water," said Mike Quinn, Chair of the Friends of Nockamixon. "The day we dedicated the dock, I could see on their faces the relief they had to be able to enjoy a day at the lake like all other kayakers."
