**Capital Improvement** – (grant award range: \$10,000–\$25,000) LOIs are due no later than **October 1st, 2019**. Following an LOI meeting with FCP, full applications are due no later than **October 15th, 2019**.



# **GRANTEE SPOTLIGHT: WOODS SERVICES**

Langhorne-based Woods Services was awarded a Capital grant in June to purchase "Second Step: A Social-Emotional Curriculum for Students with Special Needs."

Second Step is a classroom-based social skills program for students in preschool through junior high (ages 4–14 years), with a distinct curriculum for each grade. It is designed to reduce impulsive, high-risk, and aggressive behaviors and increase children's social competence and other protective factors. The program builds on cognitive behavioral intervention models integrated with social

learning theory, empathy research, and social informationprocessing research. It is intended to teach children to identify and understand their own and others' emotions, choose positive goals, and successfully manage reactions when emotionally aroused. The overall goal is to help students with intellectual disability, significant behavioral challenges and medical conditions successfully participate in Woods' pre-vocational, vocational, and

academic programs, and to ultimately live and work as independently as possible after they graduate

Woods' state-licensed and approved private school programs provide extensive, year-round special education and supports, offering individualized instruction for over 290 students that range from functional life skills to high school level academics. The students enrolled present a variety of learning needs as a result of their intellectual, developmental

and physical disabilities. Many are also diagnosed with behavioral and emotional challenges that can prevent them from participating in traditional educational settings; they require the special supports and interventions that Woods provides.
