**Capital Improvement** – (grant award range: \$10,000–\$25,000)  
LOIs are due no later than **April 1st, 2019**. Following an LOI meeting with FCP, full applications are due no later than **April 15th, 2019**.

**Partnership in Youth Services** – (grant award range: \$3,000–\$5,000)  
Application opens **July 1st, 2019**, and closes **September 1st, 2019**  
*Note: PYS applications do not require an LOI before starting a full application.*

### Wednesday, March 6, 2019

#### *Depression, Suicide, and Related Mood Disorders in Adolescents*

Data suggest that 20% of adolescents contemplate suicide. The focus of this workshop is to review current findings and evidence-based treatment practices for depression, bipolar disorder, and other mood disorders in adolescents. Particular attention will be paid to factors contributing to suicide risk and approaches to working with youth at heightened risk for suicide in outpatient settings.

This year the event honored 12 non-profit community programs in Bucks County that are making a difference in the lives of local children and their families with monetary grants of \$3,000 each.

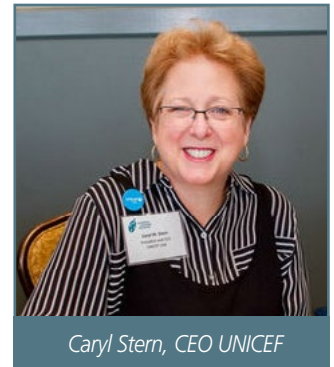
"Our goal is to collaborate and partner with non-profits serving special needs kids, teens and young adults throughout Bucks county and to increase the well-being of our children and families," said Ron Bernstein, Executive Director, Foundations Community Partnership. "We encourage you to think broadly and boldly about new ways to work together to increase our collective impact."

The event's keynote speaker was Caryl Stern, CEO, UNICEF and author of "I Believe in Zero: Learning From the World's Children." Caryl presented at the White House's inaugural summit on The United State of Women and was named one of "25 Women Changing the World in 2017" by *People* magazine, "20 Most Influential Moms of 2017" by *Family Circle*, "25 Moms We Love" by *Working Mother* magazine and "Ten Women to Watch" by *Jewish Women International*.

Foundations Executive Director Ron Bernstein, Caryl Stern, Bucks County Commissioner Diane Ellis-Marseglia, and Foundations Board Member Peggy Hanselman presented plaques and checks to the 12 local non-profit organizations.
